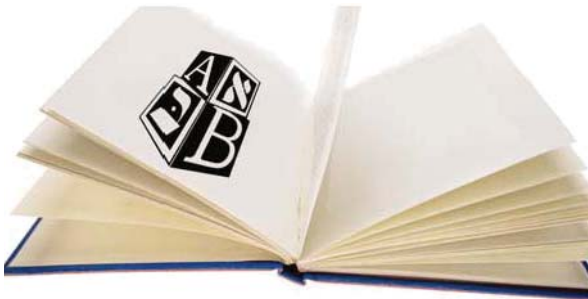

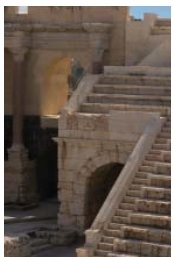
# PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS FOR A MINOR IN JEWISH EDUCATION (19 CREDITS)

## Overview

Inspired by Judaic values and the belief in the profound power of education to effect change and impact life, the Minor in Jewish Education in the School of Education at the University of Miami is based on a commitment to community and its connection to Judaism.

## Program Description

Supported through a grant from the Jack and Harriet Rosenfeld Foundation Program in Jewish Education, the Minor in Jewish Education is a collaborative effort between the University of Miami Department of Teaching and Learning in the School of Education (SOE) and the George Feldenkreis Program in Judaic Studies in the College of Arts and Sciences.



A 19 credit program, the minor is an exciting opportunity to explore and gain appreciation and respect for Jewish culture, history and religion. Furthermore, the minor offers insight into the world of education, providing innovative strategies and effective practices for educating and working with today's youth.

The minor can be taken in conjunction with most majors including (but not limited to) Human and Social Development, English, Political Science, History, International Studies, Fine Arts, Communication and Business. A minor in Jewish Education, for example, combined with a SOE major in Human and Social Development will prepare you for leadership opportunities in many educational and social Jewish organizations.

## 7 Credits in the Program in Judaic Studies

**JUS 410** Colloquium: An integrative, interdisciplinary seminar to explore how the history, structure, and values of Judaism can be related to educational thought and practice. (1 credit)

### 6 Credits in the Program in Judaic Studies may be fulfilled by one of the following options:

**Option I: UM-based Courses**  
Judaic Studies course requirements may be fulfilled by taking any two of the following courses:

**JUS 231** Jewish Civilization: Society, Culture and Religion (3 credits)

**ENG 205** Jewish Literature (3 credits)

**GEG 300** Jewish Geography (3 credits)

### Option II: UGALILEE: University of Miami Spring Semester in the Galilee

Any 6 of the 15 credits of UGALILEE course work can be used to fulfill the Judaic Studies requirements of this minor. The balance of the credits for the UGALILEE Semester program can be used to fulfill other course requirements subject to approval by UM advisors in your major program of study or in lieu of Gen Ed. Requirements as approved.

The UGALILEE semester includes classes taught by UM faculty as well as Israeli scholars. It includes the opportunity to participate in an archaeological survey and take guided study trips to Jerusalem, the Golan Heights, Masada, etc.
